- Describe how the HITECH Act affects covered entities and business associates
- Summarize how to protect patient privacy
- Explain patient rights for accessing, amending and updating their medical information
- Determine whether disclosures of PHI are acceptable
- Protect confidential health information by following proper security procedures
- Create effective passwords to protect electronic information
- Identify which information is protected by HIPAA
- Prevent identity theft by recognizing red flags as required by the Red Flags Rule

The Library consists of six courses and six refresher courses for annual reinforcement, and all coursework is designed to maintain interest and maximize learning and retention.

- Testing, remediation and case studies provide feedback on whether learners are applying policies and regulations correctly.
- “Test Your Knowledge” exercises check learner understanding at every step.
- Role-specific case scenarios apply regulations to real-life settings, ask learners how a situation should be handled and then provide the appropriate response.
- Video-based scenarios show the wrong way and the right way to handle a situation, increasing student engagement.
- New design and audio narration offers different ways to navigate the course, so students proceed through interaction, not simple reading.
- A certificate of completion documents that employees successfully finished training.
